From The President's Desk:



Orange County Historical Society representatives were on hand for the long-awaited install of a brand-new microfilm scanner at the Paoli Public Library. The equipment, which will be permanently housed in library family research room is part of the OC Historical Society's Paoli Historic Newspaper Preservation Project. The state-of-the-art scanner system and related equipment was paid for in part by a generous donation made possible by the Orange County Community Foundation. Library staff joined Society volunteers in training on the equipment in order to be able to assist patrons wanting to do research and family history. The scanner was purchased from BP Imaging Solutions of Dayton, OH. A series of devastating tornados struck Paoli late August 7th. The Museum thankfully only sustained minor damage with two upstairs windows being knocked out and the west side of the roof was damaged as well. The historic Paoli Courthouse Square sadly suffered significant damage including our beloved Courthouse. Damage to the historic Lindley Farmhouse was limited to a considerable amount of brush, limbs, trees etc. down on thegrounds. Clean Up and repair efforts are on-going. We are extremely grateful that no serious injuries were reported or lives lost during this severe storm event.

An old English proverb, "many hands make light work" is a fitting phrase for what Orange County Historical Societyhas

accomplished during the past two years. It has taken the hands of members, family and friends to bring 140 years of local and county history back home. It began as a rumor that was verified as truth. The local office of The Paoli News and The Paoli Republican, each founded in the 1800s, was shutting down. Newspapers, bound into hard cover books, plus thousands and thousands of single copies had been moved out of what had been familiar to generations as the newspaper office in Riley Building on the Paoli Square. They were placed in storage at a site in another county. It was learned little was left in the about-to-be vacant newspaper office. Salvaged were some photos, office odds and ends and awards former staff members had garnered that once held a place of honor on the office walls. A handful of members with newspaper experience had sleepless nights concerned with the future of the newspaper files. Then, came an offer to gift the papers to the Historical Society and guickly, Orange County government officials offered space in a vacant

area of a building and 26 skids of shrink wrapped newspapers and bound books came home to Paoli.

A goal to save those newspaper files, preserve them on microfilm, and purchase a reader to be located at Paoli Public Library was quickly established. To achieve it, members began a search to learn how others handled such a massive project. There were visits to the Indiana State Library, trips to out-of- state libraries and history centers and telephone calls as far away as the National Archives in Washington, D. C.

All the while there were weekly work sessions being conducted by a handful of members and volunteers. Skids were unwrapped. Newspapers were sorted and stacked by the year and date. One of every issue was set aside to be stored. Shelving was ordered to hold the massive number of bound book files. When word of the project was out, some folks saw it as a last chance to have a piece of history and offered to purchase old copies. Totes were filled with papers back to the 1930s and sold to benefit the project.

In a chat with Indiana State Library staff, interested was expressed for specific years of files absent from the state microfilmed files. In return, the Historical Society could purchase microfilm copies from the state files. Orange County Community Foundation responded to the need for a microfilm reader and located a grant. The Historical Society applied and received funds to help with the purchase. Former New-Republican staffer, Miriam Ash earmarked a \$1000 gift to the newspaper project in honor of her late husband, Paul Ash, who also had been also a member of The News-Republican staff.

Two years of work and a lot of black newspaper ink on the hands of volunteers came to a culmination the second week of September. Many years of bound files are now shelved for safe keeping. The rest were delivered to the State Library to be microfilmed and the new microfilm reader was purchased and installed at Paoli Public Library. As the hands-on work finishes, a new exhibit is being prepared at Orange County

veteran journalists and newspaper staff.



Many thanks to our friend and OCHS member Arla Spoonmoore Fraizer who recently donated the typewriter belonging to the late Mary Alice Spoonmoore to the Museum's new Orange County Historic Newspaper exhibit display. The daughter of Floyd and Osa Morris, Mary Alice, often know as Slats or Slatty, graduated from Paoli High School and attended I.U. for two years. She married Jack Spoonmoore in 1952 and spent 38 years at the Paoli Newspaper. passed away in 1992. Accepting the donation was OCHS President Robert Henderson.
